Project Overview











'Kick the Dust 1' 2018-23

Funded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund 2018-23, working with the hardest to reach young people aged 11-25 years in collaboration with key partners, including YMCA Norfolk and NCC Children's Services.

Summary of participation to end of NLHF project:

- 4,527 young people have engaged in 13,905 interventions
- 7,039 hours of high quality activities across the county
- 42% 11-16 yr olds; 54% 17-25 yr olds (34% from YMCA clients)
- 86% of all activity designed and led by young people
- Established Young Ambassador programme for 17-25 yr olds

Significant number of NMS engaged with the project - 420 staff took part in training
















47% of activity was in the West; 27% in the East; 26% in Norwich; 331 volunteering opportunities provided to 180 young people

86% of all activity involved young people leading & designing projects

Institutional Change key findings March 2023

- Kick the Dust (KtD) is an approach and not just for the heritage sector.
 It leads to young people developing transferable skills
- KtD has been successful due to the whole organisation, with strong leadership, being ready to embrace change.
- KtD has fostered a change in work culture, in particular with staff not used to working with young people
- KtD has enabled partners to see new possibilities and take on some of these ideas for their own organisations













High success rate of young people progressing from
Leader level to employment (where this was being no and Dusted pursued) with 80% stating that there were jobs for the Dust Norfolk young people like themselves

Success rate of **73**% for young people progressing from Shaper level to further learning or volunteering

94% stated they had gained a sense of achievement and increased confidence. This alongside positive impacts on mental wellbeing were a key outcome for all participants.

94% stated that they had developed transferable skills which would be useful to them going forward

95% stated that they had increased understanding of heritage and the job roles.

84% stated they had the opportunity to influence decisions



Impacts on young people

'The most important thing that Kick the Dust did for me was increase my confidence through representing the voices of other young people, inspiring me to pursue a career in the museum sector by showing me that it's a place where I'm able to make positive institutional change.' NCC Public Health funding in 2023-24 to support activity around mental health and wellbeing



Development of new evaluation framework in conjunction with the Audience Agency, NCC Public Health team, NLIS and the Young Ambassadors




Uses Warwick-Edinburgh mental wellbeing scale (WEMWBS) to understand correlation between mental health and arts and heritage, building on previous data of 26% of young people stating they suffer with their mental health

- Builds on KTD experience of both partners
- Will engage museums across the East of England and East Midlands, working with regional museums development organisations (SHARE)
- Will support museums to develop their youth engagement practice
- Will support progression and skills development for young people
- Round 1 National Lottery Heritage Fund bid successful
- NLHF Development phase underway Round 2 submission May 2024
- Project delivery over 4 years from autumn 2024










